Under Raji's leadership, her organization has led numerous technology innovations that are now foundational to eBay's business. As one of the only female CTOs at a major technology company across the industry, Raji is passionate about growing women leaders in technology both within the company and externally.

Raji earned a Bachelor's degree in computer engineering from Pune University, India. She is a fan of the San Francisco 49ers and enjoys running, skiing, and traveling. In 2012, Raji used her five-week sabbatical (a benefit earned by eBay and StubHub employees after five years with the company) to travel with her son to serve a remote and impoverished community in India. Erika Arner chairs Finnegan's patent office practice. She focuses on patent office trials, patent prosecution management, client counseling, and litigation, with an emphasis on electronic technology, computer software, and the Internet. Ms. Beckwith is Vice President, Legal at Aruba Networks. Ms. Beckwith is responsible for Aruba's worldwide commercial, employment, and intellectual property litigation and pre-litigation disputes. She also manages certain regulatory, compliance, and licensing areas, participates on Aruba's SEC disclosure committee, and oversees the legal side of Aruba's participation in various standard setting organizations. Prior to joining Aruba, Ms. Beckwith spent over eight years at Cisco Systems, Inc. where she was responsible for Cisco's worldwide intellectual property litigation. Before that, Ms. Beckwith was Senior Director, IP Litigation and Litigation for Applied Materials, Inc.

Ms. Beckwith began her legal career at what was then known as Pillsbury Madison & Sutro and also practiced law at Limbach & Limbach and Fenwick & West. Ms. Beckwith received her law degree from UC Berkeley's Boalt Hall School of Law. She also has an M.A. in Mathematics from UCLA and a B.A. in Mathematics with Honors from UC Santa Cruz.

Ms. Beckwith is a frequent invited speaker on a wide range of topics ranging from patent damages to the America Invents Act to legal issues related to standard setting organizations and FRAND commitments. In 2013, Ms. Beckwith was selected by Inside Counsel to be part of their R-3 100 program (100 women likely to be general counsel within three years) and by the Legal 500 as one of the top 100 corporate counsel of the year. Ms. Beckwith has three children ages 12, 11, and 6 who keep her on her toes.



NINA BHATTI | CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER, KOKKO, INC.

Nina Bhatti is currently the founder of a mobile technology start-up Kokko Inc.. Previously, she held a number of positions at HP, both on the research side of innovation as well as the product side of innovation. She is a technologist who is as interested in "what to build" as "how to build it." While at HP Labs, she led efforts to directly engage with some of HP's largest customers to collaborate on new products and services. She has led research on imaging applications, network application performance, web servers, streaming media servers, video conferencing systems, and multimedia interaction tools. At Nokia Ventures Organization, Nina was a senior investigator for next-generation mobile devices.

COLLEEN V. CHIEN | SENIOR ADVISOR TO THE CTO, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND INNOVATION, WHITE HOUSE OFFICE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY POLICY

Professor Colleen Chien is nationally known for her research and publications surrounding domestic and international patent law and policy issues. She has testified before Congress and the DOJ/FTC/PTO on patent issues, frequently lectures at national law conferences and has published several in-depth empirical studies, including of patent litigation, patent amicus briefs, compulsory licensing, patent-assertion entities (PAEs), and the secondary market for patents. She is an expert on the International Trade Commission (ITC), a topic on which she has authored several articles and co-authors a practice guide, *The Section 337 Patent Investigation Management Guide*.

Prior to joining the Santa Clara University School of Law faculty in 2007, Professor Chien prosecuted patents at Fenwick & West LLP in San Francisco, as an associate and then Special Counsel, and was a Fellow at the Stanford Center for Law and the Biosciences. She also did stints as a strategy consultant at Dean and Company, a spacecraft engineer at NASA/ Jet Propulsion Lab, and an investigative journalist at the Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism (as a Fulbright Scholar). She lives in the east bay with her husband and their two sons.

In 2013 Professor Chien was named the inaugural Eric Yamamoto Emerging Scholar and one of Silicon Valley's "Women of Influence." She has received gifts and grants for research including from the New America Foundation.



ISABELLA FU | ASSOCIATE GENERAL COUNSEL, MICROSOFT CORPORATION

Isabella Fu is Associate General Counsel at Microsoft Corporation, where she is responsible for copyright, trademark, and patent litigation, including matters both inside and outside of the United States. Prior to joining Microsoft, in 2003, Isabella was Director of Litigation at Intel Corporation, where she managed the worldwide litigation function and handled major antitrust and intellectual property matters before courts and regulatory agencies. Before going in-house, Isabella practiced at Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati and Orrick Herrington & Sutcliffe. She holds a JD from Columbia University and an A.B. in Physics from Harvard-Radcliffe College. She is on the executive committee of the Seattle Intellectual Property American Inn of Court, and she has a five year old son.



CHING-LEE FUKUDA | PARTNER, ROPES & GRAY LLP

Ching-Lee represents technology companies in patent litigation in the areas of electronics, software, computers, e-commerce, telecommunications, medical devices, and chemical, mechanical, and consumer products. Her 16 years of patent litigation experience includes significant courtroom victories for clients, including at summary judgment and at trial, and acting as lead counsel in multi-defendant cases brought by NPEs. Ching-Lee's successes include winning §101 arguments on behalf of both defendants and plaintiffs. Her §101 summary judgment argument in the Central District of California led to an invalidity ruling that was affirmed by the Federal Circuit in an often-cited opinion. Ching-Lee also is experienced in negotiating patent licenses and settlement agreements, providing client counseling on patent infringement and validity issues, and performing IP due diligence during the acquisition or sale of corporate entities.

She has served Senator Grassley since 1998 in various capacities, including Chief Counsel and Staff Director for the Judiciary Crime & Drugs Subcommittee and Staff Director for the Caucus on International Narcotics Control. Prior to working for Senator Grassley, Rita was an associate at Newman & Holtzinger and Morgan, Lewis & Bockius, and a law clerk at Arnold & Porter. Rita graduated from the Georgetown University School of Foreign Service and Georgetown University Law Center.



NOREEN KRALL | CHIPS CO-FOUNDER AND VICE PRESIDENT AND CHIEF LITIGATION COUNSEL, APPLE, INC.

Noreen Krall is Vice President and Chief Litigation Counsel for Apple Inc, and is responsible for all aspects of Apple's global commercial and intellectual property litigation. Ms. Krall leads a team that handles one of the largest litigation dockets in the industry, including competitor and NPE patent litigation in venues across the globe, class actions, competition law cases, commercial disputes, mass tort, small claims, and subpoenas. Ms. Krall has recently been recognized for her personal management of the global Samsung dispute leading to a \$1B jury verdict for Apple in August 2012.

Ms. Krall started her career as a systems engineer for IBM where she worked for over 12 years and held various positions in both engineering and legal, supporting IBM server, storage and services divisions. Ms. Krall earned a Bachelors Degree in Electrical Engineering from Manhattan College, a Masters Degree in Computer Science from Iona College, and a Juris Doctor from Denver University.

Ms. Krall has been recognized for her leadership skills, winning the YWCA Tribute to Women award in May 2008 and being named as one of the 50 most influential people in IP by Managing IP in 2010. She has two daughters in college studying engineering, and a third in high school who loves to play softball.

RACHEL KREVANS | PARTNER, CHAIR OF IP LITIGATION PRACTICE GROUP, MORRISON & FOERSTER LLP

Rachel Krevans is chair of the firm’s Intellectual Property Litigation Group and co-chair of the firm’s Intellectual Property Group. For more than 25 years Ms. Krevans has tried patent disputes involving all manner of products in the electronics, materials science, biosciences, and medical device areas. In 2012, she served as co-lead counsel in a high-profile smartphone case, leading to a jury verdict of over \$1 billion, and in another smartphone victory at the International Trade Commission. Chambers describes Ms. Krevans as “one of the most thorough, calculating, and technically astute IP lawyers around.” In 2013, she was named the Chambers USA Women in Law “Intellectual Property Lawyer of the Year.”

Ms. Krevans’ work has involved an assortment of technologies—from DVRs, cable and satellite TV, computer-phone interfaces, microelectromechanical systems (MEMS), and smartphones, to rare earth magnets, HIV and cancer treatments, vaccines, and blood, and antibody research.

Ms. Krevans’ contentious matters often involve some of the most difficult and complex circumstances. She has co-led trial teams in four trials in the past three years in high-profile smartphone litigation.

Ms. Krevans is perennially recommended as a leading lawyer by third-party directories such as Chambers Global, Chambers USA, The Legal 500, The International Who’s Who of Life Sciences Lawyers, IAM Patent 1000, and Best Lawyers. California Lawyer honored her in 2008 and 2014 with the prestigious “California Lawyer of the Year” award in the IP category, she was named one of The Recorder’s “Top 50 Women Leaders in Tech Law” for 2013, Daily Journal has selected her as one of the “Top 75 Female Litigators in California” from 2008-2014 and one of the “Top 75 IP Litigators in California” from 2010-2014, Benchmark Litigation included her in the 2013 list of the “Top 250 Women in Litigation,” and Managing IP included her in the 2013 list of the “Top 250 Women in IP.”

Ms. Krevans holds a B.A. from Dartmouth College and a J.D. from the University of California, Davis. After law school, she clerked for the Honorable Robert Boochever of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

**MICHELLE LEE | CHIPS CO-FOUNDER AND FORMER HEAD OF PATENTS AND PATENT STRATEGY, GOOGLE**

Michelle Lee was appointed as Deputy Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Deputy Director of the USPTO. In this position, she currently serves as the acting head of a 12,000 person agency with a budget of over \$3 billion, responsible for leading all functions of the organization and for advising the President, through the Secretary of Commerce, and the Administration on domestic and international intellectual property policy matters including patents, copyrights, and trade secrets. Prior to her most recent appointment, Ms. Lee served as the first Director of the Silicon Valley United States Patent and Trademark Office, where she formulated the vision for and lead the establishment of the Silicon Valley office of the USPTO, as well as advised the USPTO on a variety of policy matters relevant to the region.

Ms. Lee previously served as Google's first Head of Patents and Patent Strategy. In this position, Ms. Lee was responsible for the formulation and implementation of the company's worldwide patent strategy. Prior to Google, Ms. Lee was a partner in the Patent, Licensing, and Intellectual Property groups at Fenwick & West, where her practice focused on counseling high-technology companies. Before Fenwick, she litigated patent and commercial cases at Kecker & Van Nest and clerked for the Honorable Vaughn Walker, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California, and the Honorable Paul Michel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. Before law school, she worked as a computer scientist at Hewlett-Packard Research Laboratories and the MIT Artificial Intelligence Laboratory. Ms. Lee holds both an MS in computer science and a BS in electrical engineering from MIT, where she graduated at the top of her class, and a JD from Stanford.

Ms. Lee sat by appointment of the U.S. Secretary of Commerce on the USPTO's Patent Public Advisory Committee, which advises the USPTO on patent policies, goals, performance, and operations. Intellectual Asset Management recognized Ms. Lee as one of the top 50 most influential people shaping the IP market, and the SF Business Times and SJ Business Journal recognized Ms. Lee as Best Bay Area IP Lawyer in 2012 and one of the top 100 most influential women in the Silicon Valley in 2013.

JULIE MAR-SPINOLA | CHIPS CO-FOUNDER AND VP, LEGAL OPERATIONS, FINJAN HOLDINGS, INC.

Julie Mar-Spinola is the Vice President, Legal Operations of Finjan Holdings, Inc. and holds a dual business and legal role within the Company. In addition to leading the Company's legal operations, she is responsible for building the Company's IP and technology assets, and overseeing Finjan's enforcement program. Julie is also focused on alignment with fair public policy, patent reform, and licensing best practices initiatives, through active participation in respected organizations such as LES.

Ms. Mar-Spinola has dedicated more than 20 years of her career representing operating companies and individual inventors. She brings to Finjan broad and in-depth knowledge and experience in the technology sector, including M&A's, IP portfolio development, acquisition, divestitures, and licensing, as well as preservation and monetization of proprietary technologies and patents. Prior to joining Finjan, Julie had been the General Counsel for three technology companies: Alta Devices (thin film solar), Phoenix Technologies (core system BIOS software), and iolo technologies (system optimization software). Prior to her GC roles, she was VP, Global Affairs for Atmel Corporation, where she led to victory several major litigations that resulted in \$100M in jury awards and a complete defense verdict invalidating each of the five asserted patents in suit, as well as defeating the plaintiff's claim for over US \$200 million plus enhanced damages. Judge Moore clerked from 1995-1997 for the Hon. Glenn L. Archer, Jr., Chief Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. She was an Associate at Kirkland & Ellis from 1994-1995. From 1988-1992, Judge Moore was employed in electrical engineering with the Naval Surface Warfare Center. Judge Moore received her B.S.E.E. in 1990, M.S. in 1991, both from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and her J.D. (cum laude) from the Georgetown University Law Center in 1994. Judge Moore has written and presented widely on patent litigation. **SUZANNE DRENNON MUNCK | CHIEF COUNSEL FOR INTELLECTUAL

TRADE COMMISSION**

Suzanne Drennon Munck is Chief Counsel for Intellectual Property for the United States Federal Trade Commission (FTC), and Deputy Director of its Office of Policy Planning. Ms. Munck joined the FTC in 2007 and has since focused on several policy efforts, including the 2009 report addressing follow-on biologic competition and the 2011 report concerning the Evolving IP Marketplace.

In July 2013, Ms. Munck testified before the Senate Committee on the Judiciary, Subcommittee on Antitrust, Competition Policy, and Consumer Rights at its hearing entitled, “Standard Essential Patent Disputes and Antitrust Law.” In December 2012, Ms. Munck led the FTC’s efforts in a joint workshop between the FTC and the Department of Justice, exploring the impact of patent assertion entities on innovation and competition. She is the lead attorney on the FTC’s 6(b) study of this area. Ms. Munck also has significant litigation experience managing IP issues that arise during the FTC’s enforcement efforts in the high-tech and healthcare sectors.

In recognition of her work at the intersection of antitrust and intellectual property, Ms. Munck received the Paul Rand Dixon Award in 2011. She has also received the Commission’s Janet D. Steiger Award. Before joining the FTC, she was an antitrust and IP litigator in Los Angeles. She received her BA in mathematics from Bryn Mawr College and her JD from the University of Minnesota Law School.

HONORABLE PAULINE NEWMAN | FEDERAL CIRCUIT JUDGE, US COURT OF APPEALS

Judge Pauline Newman was appointed by President Ronald Reagan in 1984. From 1982 to 1984, Judge Newman was Special Adviser to the United States Delegation to the Diplomatic Conference on the Revision of the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property. She served on the advisory committee to the Domestic Policy Review of Industrial Innovation from 1978 to 1979 and on the State Department Advisory Committee on International Intellectual Property from 1974 to 1984. From 1969 to 1984, Judge Newman served as director, Patent, Trademark and Licensing Department, FMC Corp. From 1961 to 1962 she worked for the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization as a science policy specialist in the Department of Natural Sciences. She served as patent attorney and house counsel of FMC Corp. from 1954 to 1969 and as research scientist, American Cyanamid Co. from 1951 to 1954. Judge Newman received a BA from Vassar College in 1947, an MA from Columbia University in 1948, a PhD from Yale University in 1952 and an LLB from New York University School of Law in 1958.



HONORABLE KATHLEEN O'MALLEY | FEDERAL CIRCUIT JUDGE, US COURT OF APPEALS

Kathleen M. O'Malley was appointed to the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit by President Barak Obama in 2010. Prior to her elevation to the Federal Circuit, Judge O'Malley was appointed to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio by President William J. Clinton on October 12, 1994.

Judge O'Malley served as First Assistant Attorney General and Chief of Staff for Ohio Attorney General Lee Fisher from 1992-1994, and Chief Counsel to Attorney General Fisher from 1991-1992. From 1983 to 1991, Judge O'Malley was in private practice, where she focused on complex corporate and intellectual property litigation; she was with Porter, Wright, Morris & Arthur from 1985 to 1991 and with Jones Day from 1983 to 1985.

During her sixteen years on the district court bench, Judge O'Malley presided over in excess of 100 patent and trademark cases and sat by designation on the United States Circuit Court for the Federal Circuit. As an educator, Judge O'Malley has regularly taught a course on Patent Litigation at Case Western Reserve University Law School; she is a member of the faculty of the Berkeley Center for Law & Technology's program designed to educate Federal Judges regarding the handling of intellectual property cases. Judge O'Malley has served as a board member of the Sedona Conference; as the judicial liaison to the Local Patent Rules Committee for the Northern District of Ohio; and as an advisor to national organizations publishing

treatises on patent litigation (Anatomy of a Patent Case, Complex Litigation Committee of the American College of Trial Lawyers; Patent Case Management Judicial Guide, Berkeley Center for Law & Technology).

Judge O'Malley began her legal career as a law clerk to the Honorable Nathaniel R. Jones, Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals in 1982-1983. She received her JD degree from Case Western Reserve University School of Law, Order of the Coif, in 1982, where she served on Law Review and was a member of the National Mock Trial Team. Judge O'Malley attended Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio where she graduated magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa in 1979.



**HONORABLE SHARON PROST | CHIEF FEDERAL CIRCUIT JUDGE,
US COURT OF APPEALS**

Sharon Prost was born in Newburyport, Massachusetts and grew up in Hartford, Connecticut. She attended Cornell University where she earned her B.S. degree in 1973. Thereafter, in Washington, D.C. she began fifteen years of service in five different agencies of the executive branch, including as Acting Solicitor of the National Labor Relations Board. While working in the executive branch she earned three advanced degrees as a night student. In 1975, she received her M.B.A. in finance from George Washington University's Graduate School of Business. She then attended Washington College of Law at American University and received her law degree in 1979. In 1983, she earned an L.L.M. in tax law from George Washington University's Law School. On May 22, 2001, Chief Judge Prost was nominated by President George W. Bush for the position of circuit judge for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit and began her service in October 2001. She became chief judge on May 31, 2014.
